General Rules & Regulations

1. Purebred cattle must be registered with their National Breed Association. Registration Papers must be in the name of the exhibitor. Beef Cattle not registered will be entered in the Commercial-Crossbred classes.
2. Exhibitors must have owned his/her animals at least 45 days prior to the date of the show.
3. Exhibitors must provide feed, water pails and **bedding** for their animals and keep their animals and area clean and presentable at all times. **Please only use straw as bedding.**
4. No vehicle will be allowed to park adjacent to any of the barns. Exhibitors will unload their supplies and move all vehicles to designated parking areas.
5. Livestock superintendents will rule on all matters not covered by these or other department rules.
6. **Entry forms must be received by August 2, 2019.** All requested information must be completed for an entry form to be considered official. One entry form per exhibitor for each show entered. **One time \$10 Entry Fee per Exhibitor**

7. Each exhibitor exhibiting an animal and not winning a premium will receive \$5.00.
8. **Exhibitors must show their own animal in the showmanship classes.**
9. Any exhibitor using abusive or excessive force with their animal as determined by the Livestock Superintendent(s) will be asked to leave the premises and forfeit any premium money.
10. A breed must have, at a minimum, five animals for a breed show and to compete for Grand or Reserve

Champion.

11. **Exhibitor ages are determined as of January 1, 2019.**

12. Each exhibitor must assume all risks in showing his/her animals. York County Fall Livestock Show, Clemson Extension, York County 4-H, host facility and all other sponsoring parties assume no responsibility in case of accident or fire. Every reasonable precaution will be taken to prevent damage by accident or fire.

13. Concessions will be available for purchase at all shows with proceeds benefiting the York County Fall Livestock Show.

Health Requirements

All cattle should be free of any signs of infectious or contagious diseases. **All horses are required to have a negative Coggins test within 12 months.**

It is strongly encouraged that all cattle should be vaccinated for respiratory disease (shipping fever), specifically IBR, PI3, BRSV, and Pasteurella not sooner than 6 months and not less than 2 weeks prior to the show.

Rules and Regulations

1. This show is open to all SC 4-H/FFA Meat Goat Project participants that are registered through the SC Meat Goat Project.
2. **Project goats will be weighed in from 4:30pm – 5:30pm on the day of the show. Scales will close promptly at 5:45. Any goats not weighed-in, will not be permitted to show.**
3. Showmanship classes are based on participant's age as of January 1, 2019.
4. Showmanship (4 classes): Exhibitors can show any goat in Showmanship which they have entered in Market Wether (Open and SC4ME) or Market Doe classes for this show.
5. Market Open Wethers (3 classes): Only SC Meat Goat Project members will be allowed to participate in Market Wether Classes with a wether that has a Project Open ear tag. No "open" wethers are allowed.
6. Market SC4ME Wethers (3 classes): All SC4ME Wethers must be tagged with a SC4ME tag and registered to the exhibitor through the SC Meat Goat Project.
7. Market Doe (4 classes): Market does must be born between Sept 1, 2018 and July 21, 2019. Market does must be tagged with a SC Meat Goat Project ear tag and be registered to the exhibitor. Only one doe per exhibitor per class will be allowed. Each exhibitor may weigh in up to 6 does. Exhibitors with more than one doe in a class will be required to choose which doe he/she wants to show in this class.
8. Exhibitors must be able to maintain control of their animals at all times during this event. Parents are not allowed in the Show Ring during judging.

9. Clovebud exhibitors may request a senior exhibitor to accompany them in Market and Doe classes only. NO assistants will be allowed in Showmanship. The assistant is only allowed to step in & control the goat for the safety of the exhibitors or the goat. The assistant is not allowed to lead, set up, brace, or show the goat in any way.

The 3 breeds with the most entries will be shown by breed show. All others will compete in the other breeds division.**

11. **Helmets are required for ALL exhibitors in ALL classes this year. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

1. I have an accident and health insurance policy that will provide coverage for any injury or illness that may occur during my child's participation in this ACTIVITY. I understand that I am responsible for any and all costs relating to medical treatment or care of injuries or illness that my child may suffer as a result of, or while participating in, the ACTIVITY.
2. I understand that this ACTIVITY is physically strenuous and I know of no medical reason why my child should not participate.

South Carolina State 4-H Policy on Headgear Safety Equipment

The South Carolina Cooperative Extension Service 4-H Horse Program (4-H Program) requires that all **riders** wear protective headgear that meets or surpasses current applicable ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards while **riding** in all 4-H Horse Program sponsored events and activities, including events and activities offered at the County, District or State level. The headgear must be properly fitted, properly worn on the top of the head, and worn with the strap or harness securely fastened. Events and activities covered by this policy include but are not limited to State 4-H Horse Show, 4-H Horsemanship Camp, District 4-H Horse Shows and Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championship. The term "riding" as used in this policy refers to the mounting, riding or driving of a horse or pony in any 4-H sponsored event or activity. The term "rider" refers to a person engaged in riding. It is the responsibility of the rider, and the parent or guardian of the rider, to confirm that the headgear worn by the rider complies with the safety standards set forth above; is properly fitted, fastened and work; and is in sufficiently good condition that it would protect the rider in the event of an accident. The 4-H Program and the show committees, officials, judges, extension personnel and volunteers associated with the 4-H Program are not responsible for providing headgear and are not responsible for checking headgear worn by riders in order to comply with this rule.

Any rider found to be riding in violation of this policy by 4-H Horse Program employees or volunteers will be immediately prohibited from further riding, and shall be barred or disqualified from the event or activity in which the rider is engaged at the time of the violation.

The 4-H Horse Program makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, concerning the headgear worn by any rider during a 4-H Program sponsored event or activity. In particular, the 4-H Program makes no representation or warranty concerning the safety performance of any headgear worn by any rider. The 4-H Program cautions riders and their parents and legal guardians that death or serious injury may occur despite wearing safety headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk. No headgear can protect against all possible injuries.
